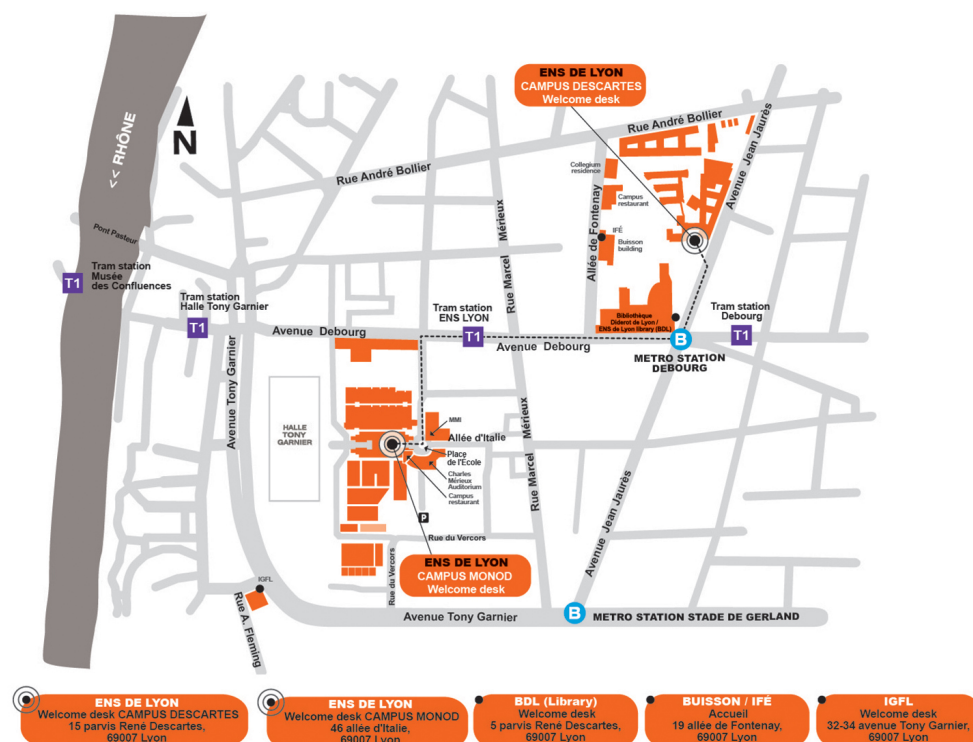


Figure 1: ENS de Lyon – Descartes Campus Layout (Right Side)

How to Get There

Lyon has an excellent public transport network called **TCL** (Metro, Tramways, and Buses). You can buy tickets at any station touchscreen machine or simply use contactless credit card at the gates.

From Lyon-Saint Exupéry Airport (LYS)

1. **Rhônexpress Tram:** Take the Rhônexpress shuttle tram from the airport terminal directly to the **Gare Part-Dieu** station (runs every 15 minutes, takes about 30 minutes).

Shuttle tickets can be bought directly at the station (from the self-serviced ticket machines) or online (<https://www.rhonexpress.fr/en/tickets-and-fares/37>).

2. **From Gare Part-Dieu:** Follow the instructions below to take Metro Line B.

From Lyon Part-Dieu Train Station

1. Take the **Metro Line B** (direction *Saint-Genis-Laval Hôpital Lyon Sud*) and get off at the **Debourg** station.
2. Take the exit *Avenue Jean Jaurès*. The entrance of the Campus (large parvis) is just a 2-minute walk from the exit.

- Take **Tramway line T1** (direction *Debourg*) and get off at the stop **Debourg**. Walk back about 1 min to the Metro station. The entrance of the Campus (large parvis) is just a 2-minute walk from the exit.

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- **Wi-Fi Access:** Eduroam is fully available across the entire campus.
- **Lunch & Coffee:** Coffee breaks will be served near the workshop room.
